

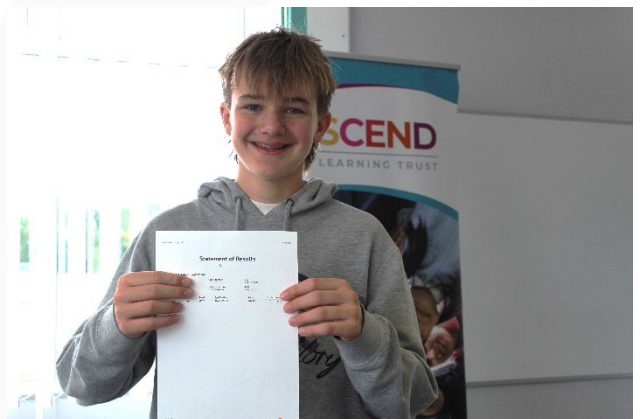
Lawn Manor Academy GCSE Results Day 2025
