

Kingsbury Green celebrates positive Ofsted

Kingsbury Green Academy is celebrating the outcome of its recent Ofsted inspection, which recognises the school's significant improvement journey and the many strengths across its community.

Inspectors highlighted that the school is moving in a clear and positive direction, with leaders taking effective action to drive improvement and strengthen provision for all pupils. The report notes that leaders have a strong understanding of the school's priorities and have implemented a coherent approach that is already bringing about positive change.

Jane Coley, CEO of Ascend Learning Trust said: "We are incredibly proud of our students, staff and the wider community. This report reflects the hard work and determination of everyone involved in the school and confirms that the improvements

we are making are the right ones."

The inspection also recognised the positive culture within the school. Pupils were found to behave well, with calm classrooms and respectful relationships contributing to a supportive learning environment where students can focus and succeed.

While the school's Behaviour and Attendance judgement currently reflects attendance levels, inspectors were clear that behaviour in school is positive. Leaders are continuing to work

closely with families to further improve attendance.

The report also acknowledges the school's inclusive ethos. Kingsbury Green Academy supports a high number of pupils with additional needs, and inspectors noted the strong support in place, enabling these students to thrive and achieve alongside their peers.

Although the Achievement judgement reflects outcomes over time, the school is seeing rapid improvement. Most pupils are achieving well, and last year saw the strongest progress scores in the school's history.

Post-16 provision is a particular strength, with vocational outcomes already in line with national standards and students well prepared for their next steps.

Looking ahead, the school will continue to focus on improving attendance, strengthening teaching and the curriculum, and ensuring every pupil achieves their full potential. Leaders intend to invite Ofsted to revisit the school following the next set of validated GCSE results, reflecting confidence in the improvements already underway.

Nicola Bull, Headteacher added: "We are excited about the future and remain fully committed to providing the very best education for every child in our school."
